- 3) Which parts of the cortex are specialized in controlling language? Empirical evidence should be cited as support. (10 marks)
- 4) Explain Robert Sternberg's Triarchic Theory of Intelligence. Please give example(s) to illustrate. (10 marks)

(C) Long Question. Answer ONE of the following questions. Please provide answers in the script book provided. The total mark for this section is 20 marks. Each question carries 20 marks.

- 1) Outline Freud's psychosexual development and discuss its implications on psychopathology. (20 marks)
- 2) What is Major Depression? Explain its causes in terms of both Biological Approach and Cognitive Approach. (20 marks)
- 3) Discuss how human memory functions in terms of the Three-Store Model of Memory. (20 marks)
